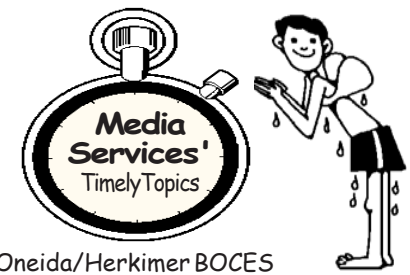
SUMMER ON THE FARM PART 2 V4028
