
TEENY-TINY AND THE WITCH WOMAN V3387

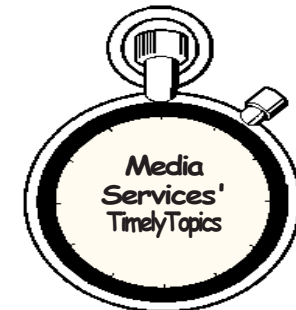
THE WITCH WHO WAS AFRAID OF WITCHES V4655
