-The reading and interest levels range from grades K-12. Many audio books and video titles are available to correlate with book titles. Pre-K print books are also available in Big Books and single copies.

-Senior high books for students include biography, current best sellers, mysteries, suspense, adventure and the classics.

-The entire multiple book library is available through WebMAX. Basic WebMAX training specifically geared for multiple books use will help you find, correlate curriculum, order the correct number of book copies and select the dates from the calendar.

- Learn to order books using WebMAX
- Suggest books for the Media Library

-Be prepared to use curriculum maps, your calendar for the Elementary Science kits, monthly planners, etc. as part of your assessment in the lab. You will also have an opportunity to browse the library to facilitate reading materials for your assessments.
