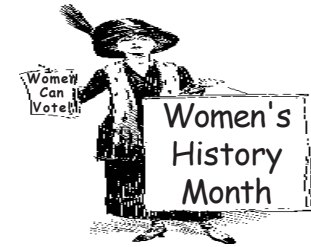
I'M DIRTY! DVD1283
