Multiple Book Copy Service - What is it? - How do I order books for my students?

The multiple book service was started 7 years ago with 48 titles, grades 4-12. It has now grown to over **800 titles** K-12. Generally we have purchased at least 30 and sometimes up to 100 copies of books on all reading levels. The majority of the primary readers are non-fiction, math, science and social studies. We also have many of the favorite chapter books for beginners, Magic Tree House, Henry & Mudge, and Little Bear. As you can see from the Teen Reader List, we also have many titles, both fiction and non-fiction for senior high.

Teachers can order as many books as they need for their students. Most titles also have teacher guides or novel guides. We purchase audio books, both on cassette or CD. All are unabridged to complement the book titles and to facilitate comprehension. There are also related materials on the author or feature film based on the book.

How to order: The easiest way is by logging into WebMAX, our online catalog. Search by title, grade level, or subject area (adventure, animal stories, biography, suspense, fantasy, etc. or by author. The multiple books are available for 21 instructional days. If you need a longer borrowing period, call Carol, 793-8515 and request your booking over the phone. When ordering, remember that the count (number of books) is in the annotation so when you get to the order form, be aware of the number of books available for that title, 30, 35, 75, etc. You cannot order more than we stock on the shelf. The order form for books is defaulted to one (1). You need to order as many as you need - 11 or 21 or 63 for example. Related media, such as teacher guide or audio book will also show up in the order form. Unclick anything you do not want.

You may also order by phoning Carol or Dorothy, 793-8515, 793-8516 and they will take your order or help you find an appropriate title for your students. Please feel free to come to 502 Court Street., 3rd floor, and browse the library. We have over 30,000 books.

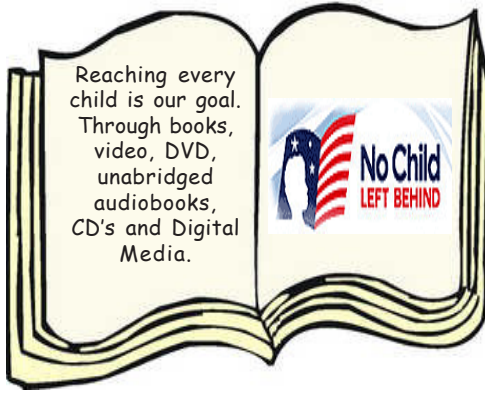
