VI. **Media Updates:**

- a. Video Furnace: Showed streaming of digital cable channels from the search page in the catalog, WebMAX. New Hartford and Oneida BOCES are piloting this digital service. More schools will be added.
- b. Teen Kids News: You can now stream the current events program for teens right from the search page in WebMAX. The program changes each week and will be archived in the Special Collections box.
- c. Assignment the World: This current events program for upper elementary students will soon be available streamed on the search page in WebMAX.
- d. Ipod pilot project for middle school science: We will be piloting 100 science titles from Visual Learning for middle grade students. More information will be forthcoming for schools who are interested in doing this.
- e. Polycom virtual field trips: We will provide a link to Polycom’s site so you will be able to find the latest virtual field trips and register. It will be on the search page in WebMAX for your convenience.

VII. **Other:** A lively discussion was initiated by Hilda Moses concerning the role of assistants and/or aides in the school library. It was decided that the basic problem is lack of understanding of a good school library program.
