Round 1 material testing underway

Five items commonly found in public libraries have been selected for initial lab testing to determine the length of time the COVID-19 virus may live on the surface of these materials. Testing began May 13, 2020, using materials provided to Battelle by Columbus Metropolitan Library, and the results of this first round are expected to be released mid-June.

In order to assist you and your member libraries with promoting Summer Reading to schools and students, attached is a current spreadsheet of public libraries that have signed up for a READsquared online registration and software product through the New York State Library contract. We hope you will continue to encourage students to visit their local public library web site to sign up NOW and find out about Summer Reading participation and exciting virtual events this year for "Imagine Your Story!"

The spreadsheet shows public libraries signed up for READsquared online software through the end of the day on Thursday, May 14. We continue to see a steady increase in public libraries signing up for READsquared, so this information changes weekly. We are asking public libraries to prominently display a READsquared logo on the home page of their web sites, as well as on their Youth Services or Summer Reading pages, to make it easier for families and students to identify the sign up for Summer Reading.

Also attached is a Summer Reading flyer to help promote sign up and participation by students in Summer Reading 2020.
